



Bythynnod: Cartrefi o waith cartref

Cottages: Home-made Homes

Ni roddwyd erioed fwy o brawf ar ddyfeisgarwch cynhenid tldion cefn gwlad nag wrth adeiladu'r tai y bu'n rhaid iddynt, yn aml, eu codi iddynt eu hunain - cartrefi o waith cartref go-iawn.

Bythynnod yw'r enw ar yr anheddau bychain hyn nad oes ganddynt, yn aml, fwy o dir na gardd neu, ar y gorau, dyddyn nad oedd yn ddigon i roi bywoliaeth, a bythynwyr yw'r enw ar y rhai a drigai ynddynt.

The native ingenuity of the poorer country people of Wales was never tested more fully than in building the dwellings that they frequently had to erect for themselves, veritable home-made homes.

These small dwellings, often accompanied by no more land than a garden or at best a small-holding insufficient to provide a living, are known as cottages, and their inhabitants as cottagers.
